**Important Information for Voters about Extended Early Voting**

- On Election Day, Tuesday, November 8, voters will only be able to vote at Early Voting sites.
- You may vote at ANY of the 12 available voting sites during Early Voting or on Election Day, regardless of your assigned precinct.
