Important Notice to All Lee County Voters: All Vote-by-Mail Ballot Requests Expired December 2022

Lee County, FL (July 12, 2023) Lee County Supervisor of Elections Tommy Doyle wants to ensure voters are aware that all previous Vote-by-Mail Ballot requests expired as of December 2022 due to a change in Florida law. As a result, voters who plan to vote by mail in 2024 must submit a new request to the office.

"The change in the law marks an unprecedented event for our office. We have a significantly low number of Vote-by-Mail requests compared to previous years," says Supervisor of Elections Tommy Doyle. "Our office began a proactive campaign earlier this year ahead of the 2024 election cycle in our effort to inform voters of this change and ensure voting accessibility for all."

Voting by mail is a safe, secure, and convenient voting method. Voters are encouraged to act now and submit their Vote-by-Mail requests before the 2024 election cycle to ensure their voices are heard!

Vote-by-Mail Ballot requests can be made <u>online</u>, by <u>mail, e-mail, fax</u>, in person at any one of our <u>branch office</u> <u>locations</u> or by phone (239) 533-8683. New requests are valid through December 2024.
